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Provisional Timeline for the AI Act



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Early 2024

The consolidated text should be agreed. The text will be subject to the lawyer-linguists review and the EU Parliament is currently expected to adopt at committee level on 13 February and at Plenary level in March.

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Mid 2024

Following formal approval at ministerial level by the Council, the AI Act will be published in the Official Journal of the EU. The AI Act enters into force 21 days after publication.

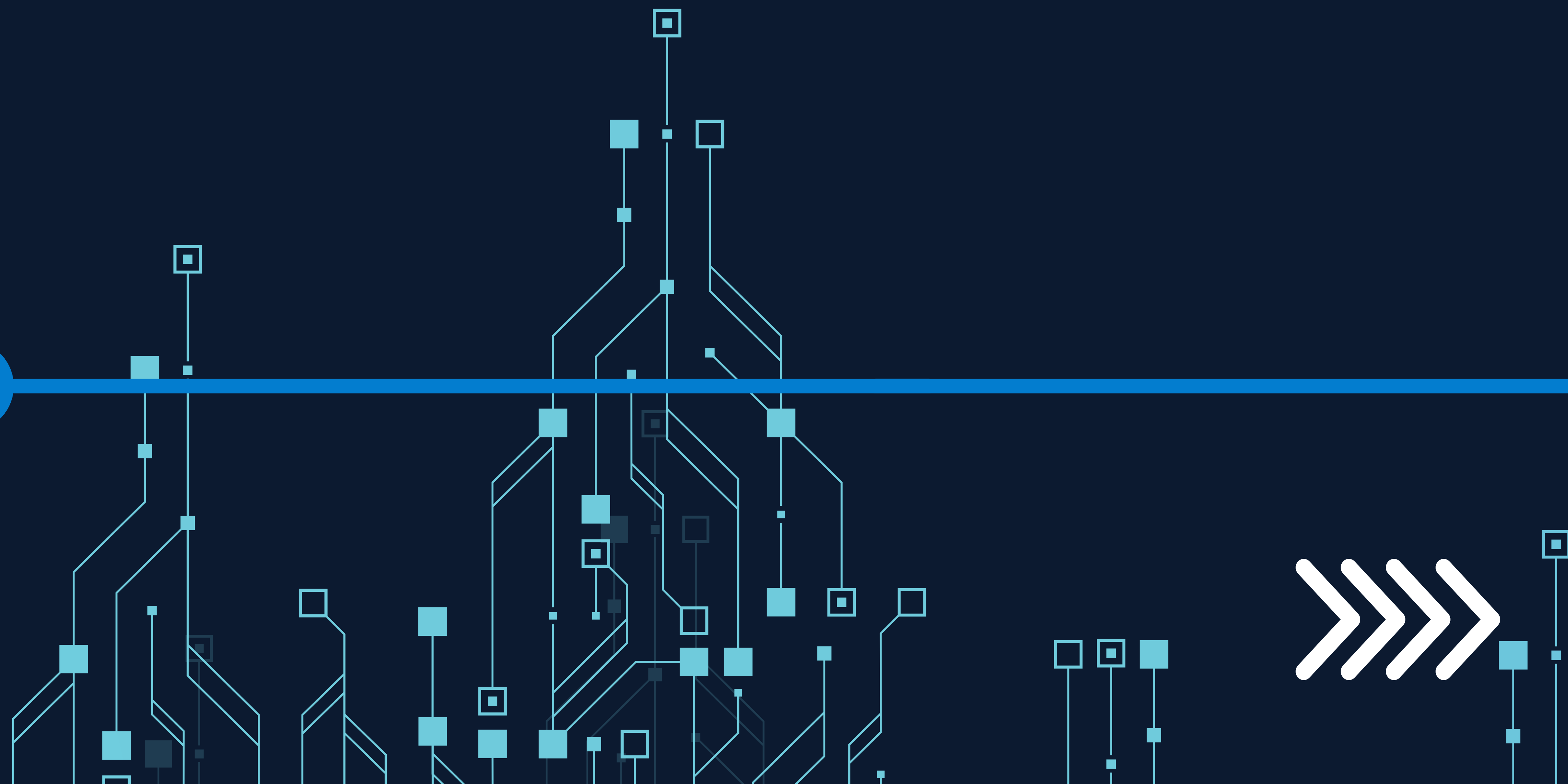


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Early 2025

The bans on Prohibited AI Systems will apply.

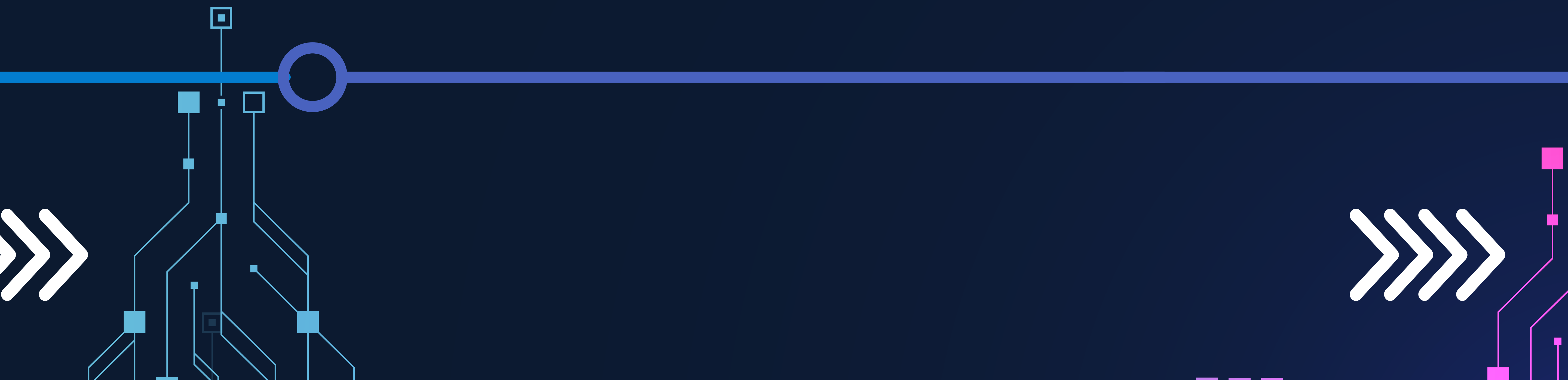


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Mid 2025

Rules on GPAI Models (such as large language models like GPT4) will apply.

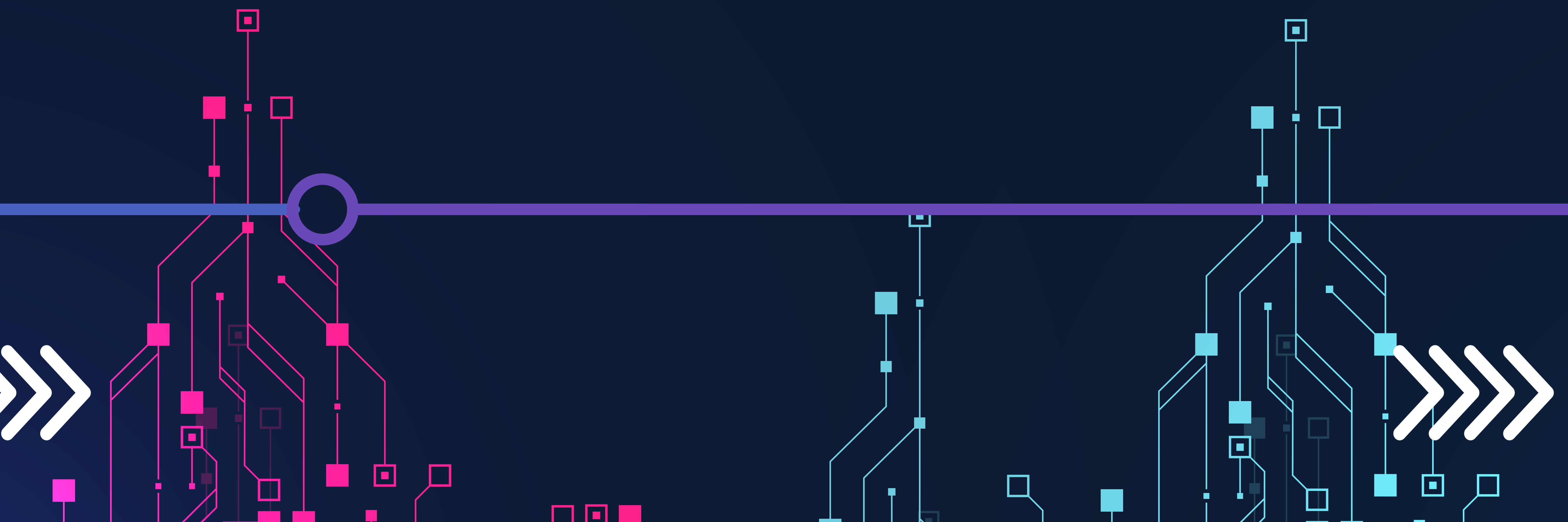


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Mid 2026

Annex II High-Risk AI Systems rules will apply (e.g. AI used in biometric profiling, management of critical infrastructure, employment, education, etc.)



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Mid 2027

Annex II High-Risk AI Systems rules will apply (e.g. where AI is a safety component in regulated products such as products governed by the EU's Machinery Regulations, etc.)
